
Good Morning, God



This map shows where the action in Genesis took place. Most believe Eden was near the area marked by the flower. Noah's ark landed on Mount Ararat in what is now Turkey (see boat symbol). Abraham left his home in Ur (camel) to go to Canaan (tent). Joseph rose from slave to ruler in Egypt (pyramid).

CREATION IDEAS. Who's Right?

When Moses wrote Genesis, the Greeks believed that the sun, moon, and stars existed before their gods came into being. The Egyptians had five ideas, all different from the Bible. In the part of the world Abraham came from, people thought that Earth was the body of a dead god called Tiamat. People came from drops of the dead god's blood.

Today many people think the universe just happened, and living things just happened too. That's not much of an explanation.

What if someone tells you to mix together all the parts lying in all the junkyards of the world and stir them up for four billion years. Then this person tells you that if you do that, you'll get a Cadillac, a Jeep, and a Ford truck. Would you believe him?

you believe him:
Living things are a lot more complicated than cars. God designed the world and living things. That's the Bible's explanation. It beats all those other ideas. And it's true.

Big Ideas in Genesis

GOD. Powerful enough to create. Wise enough to design. Loving enough to care. Trustworthy enough to keep promises. Righteous enough to hate sin. Merciful enough to forgive. Someone worth knowing!

CREATION. God designed and made all things. Evolution can't explain all the different forms of life on Earth. It can't explain you!

PEOPLE. God made people in his image and likeness. Like God, we can think, feel, imagine, remember, and make choices. You're a lot more special than any monkey's nephew!

SIN. Sin isn't just wrong. Sin is harmful. One big reason God tells us not to sin is that he doesn't want us hurt by doing wrong.

JUDGMENT. People who choose to do wrong have to suffer the consequences. The story of the great flood in Genesis 6–8 reminds us that God will punish those who keep on doing wrong.

PROMISES. God makes binding promises. We can count on God to do what he says he will do.

A Big Question?

The First Day

GENESIS 4:3-11

²¹ And his brother's name *was* Ju'-bal: he was the father of all such as handle the harp and organ.

²² And Zil'-lah, she also bare Tu'-bal-cain, an instructor of every artificer in brass and iron: and the sister of Tu'-bal-cain *was* Na'-a-mah.

¹³ Say, I pray thee, thou *art* my sister: that it may be well with me for thy sake; and my soul shall live because of thee.

¹⁴¶ And it came to pass, that, when A'-bram was come into E'-gypt, the E-gyp'-tians beheld the woman that she *was* very fair.

¹⁵ The princes also of Pha'-raoh saw her, and commended her before Pha'-raoh: and the woman was taken into Pha'-raoh's house.

¹⁶ And he entreated A'-bram well for her sake: and he had sheep, and oxen, and he asses, and menservants, and maidservants, and she asses, and camels.

God Sends Plagues

¹⁷ And the LORD plagued Pha'-raoh and his house with great plagues because of Sa'-rai A'-bram's wife.

Nand Pha'-raoh called A'-bram and said, What is this that thou hast done unto me? why didst thou not tell me that she was thy wife?

Abram and Lot Separate


⁵¶ And Lot also, which went with A'-bram, had flocks, and herds, and tents.



¹⁰ And the vale of Sid'-dim was full of slimepits; and the kings of Sod'-om and Gomor'-rah fled, and fell there; and they that remained fled to the mountain.

¹¹ And they took all the goods of Sod'-om and Go-mor'-rah, and all their victuals, and went their way.

Lot's Capture and Rescue

¹² ¶ And they took Lot, A'-bram's brother's son, who dwelt in Sod'-om, and his goods, and departed.

Hagar Given to Abram

¹⁴ And the uncircumcised man child whose flesh of his foreskin is not circumcised, that soul shall be cut off from his people; he hath broken my covenant.

¹⁸ For we will destroy this place, because the cry of them is waxen great before the face of the LORD; and the LORD hath sent us to destroy it.

¹⁴ And Lot went out, and spake unto his sons in law, which married his daughters, and said, Up, get you out of this place; for the LORD will destroy this city. But he seemed as one that mocked unto his sons in law.

¹⁵¶ And when the morning arose, then the angels hastened Lot, saying, Arise, take thy wife, and thy two daughters, which are here; lest thou be consumed in the iniquity of the city

¹⁶ And while he lingered, the men laid hold upon his hand, and upon the hand of his wife, and upon the hand of his two daughters; the LORD being merciful unto him: and they brought him forth, and set him without the city.

¹⁷¶ And it came to pass, when they had brought them forth abroad, that he said, Escape for thy life; look not behind thee, neither stay thou in all the plain; escape to the mountain, lest thou be consumed.

¹⁸ And Lot said unto them, Oh, not so, my Lord:

¹⁹ Behold now, thy servant hath found grace in thy sight, and thou hast magnified thy mercy,

which thou hast shewed unto me in saving my life; and I cannot escape to the mountain, lest some evil take me. and I die:

Note that the second representation 20 Behold now, this city is near to flee unto, and it is a little one: Oh, let me escape thither, (is it not a little one?) and my soul shall live.

²¹ And he said unto him, See, I have accepted thee concerning this thing also, that I will not overthrow this city, for the which thou hast spoken.

²² Haste thee, escape thither; for I cannot do any thing till thou be come thither. Therefore the name of the city was called Zo'-ar.

²³ ¶ The sun was risen upon the earth when Lot entered into Zo'-ar.

Sodom and Gomorrah Destroyed

²⁴ Then the LORD rained upon Sod'-om and upon Go-mor'-rah brimstone and fire from the LORD out of heaven;

²⁵ And he overthrew those cities, and all the plain, and all the inhabitants of the cities, and that which grew upon the ground.

²⁶ ¶ But his wife looked back from behind him, and she became a pillar of salt.

²⁷ ¶ And A'-bra-ham gat up early in the morning to the place where he stood before the LORD:

²⁸ And he looked toward Sod'-om and Gomor'-rah, and toward all the land of the plain, and beheld, and, lo, the smoke of the country went up as the smoke of a furnace.

²⁹ ¶ And it came to pass, when God destroyed the cities of the plain, that God remembered A'-bra-ham, and sent Lot out of the midst of the overthrow, when he overthrew the cities in the which Lot dwelt.

The Birth of Moab and Benammi

³⁰¶ And Lot went up out of Zo'-ar, and dwelt in the mountain, and his two daughters with him; for he feared to dwell in Zo'-ar: and he dwelt in a cave, he and his two daughters.

³¹ And the firstborn said unto the younger, Our father *is* old, and *there is* not a man in the earth to come in unto us after the manner of all the earth:

³² Come, let us make our father drink wine, and we will lie with him, that we may preserve seed of our father.

³³ And they made their father drink wine that night: and the firstborn went in, and lay with her father; and he perceived not when she lay down, nor when she arose.

³⁴ And it came to pass on the morrow, that the firstborn said unto the younger, Behold, I lay yesternight with my father: let us make

him drink wine this night also; and go thou in, *and* lie with him, that we may preserve seed of our father.

³⁵ And they made their father drink wine that night also: and the younger arose, and lay with him; and he perceived not when she lay down, nor when she arose.

³⁶ Thus were both the daughters of Lot with child by their father.

³⁷¶ And the firstborn bare a son, and called his name Mo'-ab: the same *is* the father of the Mo'-ab-ites unto this day.

³⁸ And the younger, she also bare a son, and called his name Ben-am'-mi: the same *is* the father of the children of Am'-mon unto this day.

Abraham Deceives Abimelech

¹ And A'-bra-ham journeyed from thence toward the south country, and dwelled between Ka'-desh and Shur, and sojourned in Ge'-rar.

²¶ And A'-bra-ham said of Sa'-rah his wife, She *is* my sister: and A-bim'-e-lech king of Ge'rar sent, and took Sa'-rah.

³¶ But God came to A-bim'-e-lech in a dream by night, and said to him, Behold, thou *art but* a dead man, for the woman which thou hast taken: for she *is* a man's wife.

⁴ But A-bim'-e-lech had not come near her: and he said, Lord, wilt thou slay also a righteous nation?

⁵ Said he not unto me, She *is* my sister? and she, even she herself said, He *is* my brother: in the integrity of my heart and innocency of my hands have I done this.

⁶ And God said unto him in a dream, Yea, I know that thou didst this in the integrity of thy heart; for I also withheld thee from sinning against me: therefore suffered I thee not to touch her.

⁷ Now therefore restore the man *his* wife; for he *is* a prophet, and he shall pray for thee, and thou shalt live: and if thou restore *her* not, know thou that thou shalt surely die, thou, and all that *are* thine.

8 Therefore A-bim'-e-lech rose early in the morning, and called all his servants, and told all these things in their ears: and the men were sore afraid.

Abimelech Reproaches Abraham

⁹Then A-bim'-e-lech called A'-bra-ham, and said unto him, What hast thou done unto us? and what have I offended thee, that thou hast brought on me and on my kingdom a great sin? thou hast done deeds unto me that ought not to be done.

¹⁰ And A-bim'-e-lech said unto A'-bra-ham, What sawest thou, that thou hast done this thing?

¹¹ And A'-bra-ham said, Because I thought, Surely the fear of God *is* not in this place; and they will slay me for my wife's sake.

¹² And yet indeed *she is* my sister; she *is* the daughter of my father, but not the daughter of my mother; and she became my wife.

¹³ And it came to pass, when God caused me to wander from my father's house, that I said unto her, This *is* thy kindness which thou shalt shew unto me; at every place whither we shall come, say of me, He *is* my brother.

¹⁴¶ And A-bim'-e-lech took sheep, and oxen, and menservants, and womenservants, and gave *them* unto A'-bra-ham, and restored him Sa'-rah his wife.

¹⁵ And A-bim'-e-lech said, Behold, my land *is* before thee: dwell where it pleaseth thee.

¹⁶ And unto Sa'-rah he said, Behold, I have given thy brother a thousand *pieces* of silver: behold, he *is* to thee a covering of the eyes, unto all that *are* with thee, and with all *other*: thus she was reproved.

Abraham Prays for Abimelech

¹⁷ ¶ So A'-bra-ham prayed unto God: and God healed A-bim'-e-lech, and his wife, and his maidservants; and they bare *children*.

¹⁸ For the LORD had fast closed up all the wombs of the house of A-bim'-e-lech, because of Sa'-rah A'-bra-ham's wife.

The Birth of Isaac

¹ And the LORD visited Sa'-rah as he had said, and the LORD did unto Sa'-rah as he had spoken.

² For Sa'-rah conceived, and bare A'-bra-ham a son in his old age, at the set time of which God had spoken to him.

³ And A'-bra-ham called the name of his son that was born unto him, whom Sa'-rah bare to him. I'-saac.

 4 ¶ And A'-bra-ham circumcised his son I'-saac being eight days old, as God had commanded him.

⁵ And A'-bra-ham was an hundred years old, when his son I'-saac was born unto him.

⁶¶ And Sa'-rah said, God hath made me to laugh, *so that* all that hear will laugh with me.

⁷ And she said, Who would have said unto A'-bra-ham, that Sa'-rah should have given children suck? for I have born *him* a son in his old age.

⁸ And the child grew, and was weaned: and A'-bra-ham made a great feast the *same* day that I'-saac was weaned.

Hagar Cast Out

⁹¶ And Sa'-rah saw the son of Ha'-gar the E-gyp'-tian, which she had born unto A'-bra-ham, mocking.

¹⁰ Wherefore she said unto A'-bra-ham, Cast out this bondwoman and her son: for the son of this bondwoman shall not be heir with my son, *even* with I'-saac.

¹¹ And the thing was very grievous in A'-bra-ham's sight because of his son.

¹²¶ And God said unto A'-bra-ham, Let it not be grievous in thy sight because of the lad, and because of thy bondwoman; in all that Sa'-rah hath said unto thee, hearken unto her voice; for in I'-saac shall thy seed be called.

¹³ And also of the son of the bondwoman will I make a nation, because he *is* thy seed.

¹⁴ And A'-bra-ham rose up early in the morning, and took bread, and a bottle of water, and gave *it* unto Ha'-gar, putting *it* on her shoulder, and the child, and sent her away: and she departed, and wandered in the wilderness of Be'-er-she'-ba.

¹⁵ And the water was spent in the bottle, and she cast the child under one of the shrubs.

¹⁶ And she went, and sat her down over against *him* a good way off, as it were a bowshot: for she said, Let me not see the death of the child. And she sat over against *him*, and lift up her voice, and wept.

God Consoles Hagar

¹⁷ ¶ And God heard the voice of the lad; and the angel of God called to Ha'-gar out of heaven, and said unto her, What aileth thee, Ha'-gar? fear not; for God hath heard the voice of the lad where he is.

¹⁸ Arise, lift up the lad, and hold him in thine hand; for I will make him a great nation.

¹⁹ And God opened her eyes, and she saw a well of water; and she went, and filled the bottle with water, and gave the lad drink.

²⁰ And God was with the lad; and he grew, and dwelt in the wilderness, and became an archer.

 21 And he dwelt in the wilderness of Pa'-ran: and his mother took him a wife out of the land of E'-gypt.

A Covenant with Abimelech

²² ¶ And it came to pass at that time, that A-bim'-e-lech and Phi'-chol the chief captain of his host spake unto A'-bra-ham, saying, God is with thee in all that thou doest:

²³ Now therefore swear unto me here by God that thou wilt not deal falsely with me, nor with my son, nor with my son's son: *but* according to the kindness that I have done unto thee, thou

shalt do unto me, and to the land wherein thou hast sojourned.

²⁴ And A'-bra-ham said, I will swear.

²⁵ And A'-bra-ham reproved A-bim'-e-lech because of a well of water, which A-bim'-e-lech's servants had violently taken away.

²⁶ And A-bim'-e-lech said, I wot not who hath done this thing; neither didst thou tell me, neither yet heard I *of it*, but to day.

³⁷ And A'-bra-ham took sheep and oxen, and gave them unto A-bim'-e-lech; and both of them made a covenant.

²⁸ And A'-bra-ham set seven ewe lambs of the flock by themselves.

²⁹ And A-bim'-e-lech said unto A'-bra-ham, What mean these seven ewe lambs which thou hast set by themselves?

³⁰ And he said, For *these* seven ewe lambs shalt thou take of my hand, that they may be a witness unto me, that I have digged this well.

³¹ Wherefore he called that place Be'-er-she'-ba; because there they sware both of them.

³² Thus they made a covenant at Be'-er-she'-ba: then A-bim'-e-lech rose up, and Phi'-chol the chief captain of his host, and they returned into the land of the Phil'-is-tines.

³³¶ And *Abraham* planted a grove in Be'-er-she'-ba, and called there on the name of the LORD, the everlasting God.

³⁴ And A'-bra-ham sojourned in the Phil'-istines' land many days.

Isaac to Be Offered as a Sacrifice

22 ¹And it came to pass after these things, that God did tempt A'-bra-ham, and said unto him, A'-bra-ham: and he said, Behold, *here* I *am*.

² And he said, Take now thy son, thine only son I'-saac, whom thou lovest, and get thee into the land of Mo-ri'-ah; and offer him there for a burnt offering upon one of the mountains which I will tell thee of.

³ ¶ And A'-bra-ham rose up early in the morning, and saddled his ass, and took two of his young men with him, and I'-saac his son, and clave the wood for the burnt offering, and rose up, and went unto the place of which God had told him.

⁴Then on the third day A'-bra-ham lifted up his eyes, and saw the place afar off.

⁵ And A'-bra-ham said unto his young men, Abide ye here with the ass; and I and the lad will go yonder and worship, and come again to you.

⁶ And A'-bra-ham took the wood of the burnt offering, and laid *it* upon I'-saac his son; and he took the fire in his hand, and a knife; and they went both of them together.

⁷ And I'-saac spake unto A'-bra-ham his

¹⁰ And A'-bra-ham stretched forth his hand, and took the knife to slav his son.

¹¹ And the angel of the LORD called unto him out of heaven, and said, A'-bra-ham, A'-bra-ham: and he said, Here *am* I.

¹² And he said, Lay not thine hand upon the lad, neither do thou any thing unto him: for now I know that thou fearest God, seeing thou hast not withheld thy son, thine only *son* from me.

Abraham Blessed

 15 ¶ And the angel of the LORD called unto A'-bra-ham out of heaven the second time,

¹⁶ And said, By myself have I sworn, saith the LORD, for because thou hast done this thing, and hast not withheld thy son, thine only *son*:

¹⁷ That in blessing I will bless thee, and in multiplying I will multiply thy seed as the stars of the heaven, and as the sand which *is* upon the sea shore; and thy seed shall possess the gate of his enemies;

¹⁸ And in thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed; because thou hast obeyed

my voice.

¹⁹ So A'-bra-ham returned unto his young men, and they rose up and went together to Be'-er-she'-ba; and A'-bra-ham dwelt at Be'-er-she'-ba.

Nahor's Descendants

²⁰ ¶ And it came to pass after these things, that it was told A'-bra-ham, saying, Behold, Mil'-cah, she hath also born children unto thy brother Na'-hor:

²¹ Huz his firstborn, and Buz his brother, and Ke-mu'-el the father of A'-ram.

²² And Che'-sed, and Ha'-zo, and Pil'-dash,

and Jid'-laph, and Beth-u'-el.

²³ And Beth-u'-el begat Re-l

²³ And Beth-u'-el begat Re-bek'-ah: these eight Mil'-cah did bear to Na'-hor, A'-bra-ham's brother.

²⁴ And his concubine, whose name *was* Reu'-mah, she bare also Te'-bah, and Ga'-ham, and Tha'-hash, and Ma'-a-chah.

23 And Sa'-rah was an hundred and seven and twenty years old: *these were* the years of the life of Sa'-rah.

² And Sa'-rah died in Kir'-jath-ar'-ba; the same *is* He'-bron in the land of Ca'-na-an: and A'-bra-ham came to mourn for Sa'-rah, and to weep for her.

The Purchase of Machpelah

³¶ And A'-bra-ham stood up from before his dead, and spake unto the sons of Heth, saying,

⁴ I *am* a stranger and a sojourner with you: give me a possession of a buryingplace with you, that I may bury my dead out of my sight.

⁵ And the children of Heth answered A'-braham, saving unto him,

⁶ Hear us, my lord: thou *art* a mighty prince among us: in the choice of our sepulchres bury thy dead; none of us shall withhold from thee his sepulchre, but that thou mayest bury thy dead.

⁷ And A'-bra-ham stood up, and bowed himself to the people of the land, *even* to the children of Heth.

⁸ And he communed with them, saying, If it be your mind that I should bury my dead out of my sight; hear me, and intreat for me to E'-phron the son of Zo'-har,

⁹ That he may give me the cave of Machpe'-lah, which he hath, which *is* in the end of his field; for as much money as it is worth he shall give it me for a possession of a buryingplace amongst you.

¹⁰ And E'-phron dwelt among the children of Heth: and E'-phron the Hit'-tite answered A'-bra-ham in the audience of the children of Heth, *even* of all that went in at the gate of his city, saying.

"Nay, my lord, hear me: the field give I thee, and the cave that *is* therein, I give it thee; in the presence of the sons of my people give I it thee: bury thy dead.

¹² And A'-bra-ham bowed down himself be-

fore the people of the land.

¹³ And he spake unto E'-phron in the audi-

ence of the people of the land, saying, But if thou wilt give it, I pray thee, hear me: I will give thee money for the field; take it of me, and I will bury my dead there.

¹⁴ And E'-phron answered A'-bra-ham, saying unto him,

¹⁵ My lord, hearken unto me: the land *is worth* four hundred she'-kels of silver; what is that betwixt me and thee? bury therefore thy dead.

¹⁶ And A'-bra-ham hearkened unto E'-phron; and A'-bra-ham weighed to E'-phron the silver, which he had named in the audience of the sons of Heth, four hundred she'-kels of silver, current *money* with the merchant.

"¶ And the field of E'-phron which was in Mach-pe'-lah, which was before Mam'-re, the field, and the cave which was therein, and all the trees that were in the field, that were in all the borders round about, were made sure

²⁰ And the field, and the cave that *is* therein, were made sure unto A'-bra-ham for a possession of a buryingplace by the sons of Heth.

24 And A'-bra-ham was old, and well stricken in age: and the LORD had blessed A'-bra-ham in all things.

² And A'-bra-ham said unto his eldest servant of his house, that ruled over all that he had, Put, I pray thee, thy hand under my thigh:

³ And I will make thee swear by the LORD, the God of heaven, and the God of the earth, that thou shalt not take a wife unto my son of the daughters of the Ca'-na-an-ites, among whom I dwell:

⁴ But thou shalt go unto my country, and to my kindred, and take a wife unto my son I'-saac.

⁵ And the servant said unto him, Peradventure the woman will not be willing to follow me unto this land: must I needs bring thy son again unto the land from whence thou camest?

⁶ And A'-bra-ham said unto him, Beware thou that thou bring not my son thither again.

⁷¶ The LORD God of heaven, which took me from my father's house, and from the land of my kindred, and which spake unto me, and that sware unto me, saying, Unto thy seed will

I give this land; he shall send his angel before thee, and thou shalt take a wife unto my son from thence.

⁸ And if the woman will not be willing to follow thee, then thou shalt be clear from this my oath: only bring not my son thither again.

⁹ And the servant put his hand under the thigh of A'-bra-ham his master, and sware to him concerning that matter.

The Servant's Prayer

¹⁰ ¶ And the servant took ten camels of the camels of his master, and departed; for all the goods of his master were in his hand: and he arose, and went to Mes-o-po-ta'-mi-a, unto the city of Na'-hor.

¹¹ And he made his camels to kneel down without the city by a well of water at the time of the evening, *even* the time that women go out to draw *water*.

¹² And he said O LORD God of my master A'-bra-ham, I pray thee, send me good speed this day, and shew kindness unto my master A'-bra-ham.

¹³ Behold, I stand *here* by the well of water; and the daughters of the men of the city come out to draw water:

¹⁴ And let it come to pass, that the damsel to whom I shall say, Let down thy pitcher, I pray thee, that I may drink; and she shall say, Drink, and I will give thy camels drink also: *let the same be* she *that* thou hast appointed for thy servant I'-saac; and thereby shall I know that thou hast shewed kindness unto my master.

Rebekah: An Answer to Prayer

¹⁵¶ And it came to pass, before he had done speaking, that, behold, Re-bek'-ah came out, who was born to Beth-u'-el, son of Mil'-cah, the wife of Na'-hor, A'-bra-ham's brother, with her pitcher upon her shoulder.

¹⁶ And the damsel *was* very fair to look upon, a virgin, neither had any man known her: and she went down to the well, and filled her pitcher, and came up.

¹⁷ And the servant ran to meet her, and said, Let me, I pray thee, drink a little water of thy pitcher.

¹⁸ And she said, Drink, my lord: and she hasted, and let down her pitcher upon her hand, and gave him drink.

¹⁹ And when she had done giving him drink, she said, I will draw *water* for thy camels also, until they have done drinking.

²⁰ And she hasted, and emptied her pitcher into the trough, and ran again unto the well to draw *water*, and drew for all his camels.

Rebekah

Rebekah's kindness impressed Abraham's servant.

Rebekah was Abraham's great-niece. Abraham had sent a servant to his distant relatives to find a bride for his son Isaac. The servant prayed that God would lead him to the right young woman by giving him a sign.

The servant's prayer was answered when Rebekah gladly drew water for the visitor and also volunteered to draw water for his camels.

Showing hospitality was an important virtue in Bible times. Rebekah welcomed the visitor into her home, and there Abraham's servant explained the reason for his visit.

When Rebekah's family heard how the Lord had answered the servant's prayer, they decided to let Rebekah go with him. And when Rebekah was asked if she wanted to be Isaac's wife, she said, "I will go."

Rebekah became Isaac's wife, and the Bible says, "He loved her."
