

KEEPING CHARACTER AND FAITH INTEGRATED NOT JUST IN OUR YOUTH ROOM, BUT EVERYWHERE THEY GO

The end goal of youth ministry is to form disciples with the character of Christ, yet studies indicate that about half of students drift from their faith after graduation. This statistic begs the question: How do we keep students engaged in their faith outside of youth group?

Faith Beyond Youth Group: Five Ways to Form Character and Cultivate Lifelong Discipleship (Baker Books, November 7, 2023) offers the latest research on how to encourage a lasting faith in the next generation. Fuller Youth Institute's Kara Powell, Jen Bradbury, and Brad M. Griffin seek to increase the impact youth leaders have on their students' lives by rediscovering Christlike character in Scripture and in everyday life.

Powell, Bradbury, and Griffin offer a compass that moves leaders beyond their burnout, increases their impact, and fills in the "character gap" that causes students to abandon their faith. The five points of the Faith Beyond Youth Group Compass are:

- **Cultivating Trust**—leveraging relational strengths to develop identity, belonging, and purpose
- Modeling Growth—modeling consistency and integrity while living out faith authentically
- Teach for Transformation—using the strategies of Jesus to transform teenagers' identities
- Practice Together—moving faith out of students' heads and into their hands and feet
- Make Meaning—helping students understand who they are and who they can be in Jesus

"We believe we can rediscover how Scripture keeps character and faith integrated rather than either obsessing over rules or separating spirituality from the rest of life," writes Powell. "If faith is what is believed, then character is faith lived out in real time."

Let's disciple teens today so they won't have to deconstruct their faith tomorrow.

SAMPLE INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

- → Why do you think it's so important for us to be talking about youth ministry today?
- → Your new book, Faith Beyond Youth Group, is a timely message for the Church because so many kids leave the faith after high school. We hear a lot about church dropouts, religious "nones"—those who claim no affiliation—and faith "deconstruction." What surprised you as you researched character-forming discipleship in light of this backdrop? What stood out the most?
- "Character" is a surprisingly loaded term and has been mishandled in ways that can make it feel outdated or even harmful to young people. What is a more helpful view of character today?
- □ It seems like everywhere we turn, we hear about another person with a moral / character failing. How do such stories impact young people? How does your research suggest we deal with such failure?
- → Youth leaders so often feel burnt out, and in many cases, they feel this way because they are having too little impact. Tell us about a story of burnout—either from you or a youth leader you know. How would/did the Faith Beyond Youth Group Compass have helped in those moments?
- Cultivating trust is all about relationships. How can we foster better relationships with Gen-Z specifically? What makes this generation different than previous generations?
- Modeling growth is one way adults can have a really big impact on students because we live in a world where a person's character, or their private life, doesn't always match what we see publicly or in church. How can youth leaders do more to model integrity and virtue?
- → You mention that "character is caught before it's taught." Can you give us an example of this?
- → We've talked a little bit about what sets Gen-Z apart from other generations. How can we take that knowledge and apply it to our interactions with teens? How can we teach in ways that actually lead to transformation?
- □ "Practice Together" and "Making Meaning" are the last two points on the Faith Beyond Youth Group Compass. What are some of the events / circumstances that young people need to make meaning from? How can we help them do this, particularly by practicing together?
- What can youth ministry leaders do to get started? How can they implement this new compass in their ministries?
